Focus by Fr Matthias Ogwo

Commandment of Love: love of God and love of neighbour

God, who is love, created us to love and so that we can love others while remaining united with him. It would be misleading to claim to love our neighbour without loving God; and it would also be deceptive to claim to love God without loving our neighbour. The two dimensions of love, for God and for neighbour, in their unity characterize the disciple of Christ, says Pope Francis.

The above expression summarizes Mark 12:28-34 narrative of the commandment of love as taught by Jesus in the gospel reading of today. Love that comes from God and spreads to all is the unification of all the commandments.

Focus by Fr Andrew Hogan

On Monday we celebrate All Saints. We recognise the connection: the communion that we have with those who have gone before us. We also recognise the good work that God has Fr Andrew Hogan - Associate done in and through those holy men and women.

On Tuesday, All Souls Day, we hold holy the memory of all the faithful who have been called to return to God. We remember their names before God; we pray that they would be received into God's presence and love; and we rejoice because we are all part of the Communion of Saints, we are all destined for life in heaven, and we will be welcomed by Jesus and by our friends, for whom we have been praying all along. These are the realities that we for the Cathedral Parish celebrate during these days.

Saint Paul encouraged the people of Thessalonika as he wrote, that although we might wish to cling to the earthly body, it is not that which makes us, us. Our true nature, that which Fr Jayanthi Maddala-Associate glorifies God and exemplifies the wonder of our creation, is that which is imperishable. When we hold the promise of Christ, the frail body of this earth is transformed into the glorious body of the resurrection.

Death comes to us all, but as we hear from St Paul, it is nothing to be feared: for Christ shows each and every one of us his promise. Through Christ's death for us, through his overcoming of death in the triumph of the resurrection, Jesus Christ has destroyed death and has given us true hope.

The old order has passed away: welcome them into paradise, where there will be no sorrow, no weeping or pain, but fullness of peace and joy with your Son and the Holy Spirit forever and ever.


November Memorial Service

All Saints 1 November & All Souls | Safeguarding 2 November

Next week the Catholic Church celebrates two significant events.

On Monday the 1st of November we celebrate All Saints' Day. As the name suggests, this solemn holy day is dedicated to the saints of the church, which are those souls who have entered heaven. All Saints' day has been around for quite a few years, having been formally started by Pope Boniface IV in the roaring 600s (more specifically 609AD).

Also established by Pope Boniface IV was All Souls Day, which we will celebrate on Tuesday the 2nd of November. Between the two days is that on All Souls' Day we pray for those who have died and have not yet reached heaven. Through our prayers, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven.

Our Parish prepares a special 'Please Pray For List' in which we ask parishioners to consider selecting a few names from the list in order to pray for their souls. If you wish for your loved ones to be remembered during the November Masses, please use the envelope found at the front door or the church.




