

Gospel Reflection by Fr Matthias Ogwo

In today's Gospel the Pharisees and some of the Scribes complain to Jesus that his disciples fail to observe the tradition of the elders. The controversy was the fact that the disciples ate without first washing their hands.

Jesus called this attitude hypocrisy and goes ahead to quote the prophet Isaiah: This people honour me only with lip service, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations.

Religion has to be better than mere external observance of rules, laws, traditions and rituals. God's laws are supposed to bring our hearts closer to God and to his

people in love. The best way to be faithful to God's law is to allow our hearts to be transformed by it and lead us into deeper relationship with God. Let God's law find expressions in the way we live, love, and treat one another.

Cathedral Gets a New, Easy way to Donate

With this in mind, our Parish is rolling out a simple, COVID compliant way to donate while at church, using your phone with our Donation Point Go system. It works with a QR code which has become something we are all too familiar with due to the pandemic.

To donate, scan the QR code with your smartphone to be redirected to a secure Parish webpage. Then type in your card details in to the secure page or use your e-wallet. Then click the pay/donate button with the amount you wish to donate fully customisable.

Social Justice Sunday This Weekend

The celebration of Social Justice Sunday is a long tradition in the Catholic Church in Australia. For almost every year since 1940, our bishops have joined together to issue a major social justice statement at this time.

This year's social justice statement is 'Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor'. The statement affirms that "we human beings need a change of heart, mind and behaviour." It draws from Scripture, from the theological tradition, from Catholic Social Teaching, and from the wisdom of the world, including the insights of the First Nations.

In the Statement, the Bishops invite the whole Catholic community to join them in taking up Pope Francis' invitation to a seven-year journey towards total ecological sustainability, guided by seven Laudato Si' Goals. These goals are: response to the cry of the earth, response to the of the poor; ecological economics; sustainable lifestyles; ecological spirituality; ecological education; and community engagement and participatory action.




