Gospel Reflection by Fr Andrew Hogan

Jealousy is a curse – so the old adage goes.

Closely aligned with envy, jealousy occurs when something we already possess (usually a special relationship) is threatened by a third person while envy is when we lack a desired attribute enjoyed by another. Jealousy brings with it a sense of betrayal while envy embodies an acute sense of inferiority. While the two are distinct, they often come hand in hand in our daily life and experience.

Jealousy and envy comes in all shapes and forms. We can become jealous of another person's: possessions, wealth, financial assets (this is what covetousness is).

recognition, opportunities, privileges, advantages.

looks, appearance, beauty, health.

personality, abilities, talents, skills.

awards, accomplishments, achievements, popularity.

position, job, status, placement at work, prestige.

intelligence, knowledge, education.

spouse, family, friends, relationships.

In the Gospel, the apostle John objects to a person who was not in their group, casting out demons in Jesus' name. Jesus himself had no problem with this. John's objection was born out of jealousy. He was threatened by an 'outsider' moving in on their territory. As we see in this gospel encounter, jealousy can poison our outlook even when what is done by another is good. We can all identify moments in our lives and the lives of others when we have allowed jealousy to overtake us and sour an otherwise positive event. Conversely, we too, know the joy of being able to rejoice in good that is being done, irrespective of who is the person doing it.

"Good Christians, my children, do not do so; they envy no one; they love their neighbour; they rejoice at the good that happens to him, and they weep with him if any misfortune comes upon him. How happy should we be if we were good Christians. Ah! my children, let us, then, be good Christians and we shall no more envy the good fortune of our neighbour; we shall never speak evil of him; we shall enjoy a sweet peace; our soul will be calm; we shall find paradise on earth."

Youth Gospel Reflection

The first part of today's gospel deals with the disciples' jealousy at someone else 'cashing in' on Jesus' name and authority. It is a continuation of their limited understanding about the message and ministry of Jesus. They still cling to an idea that Jesus is going to rise up in power against the forces of Rome and, in the aftermath, they are going to be sitting pretty as associates of this powerful figure. The disciples have been blinded by their dreams of glory and forgotten that the real story is that people are being cured and having demons cast out. Rather than celebrating the healing that is occurring in Jesus' name, the disciples are jealous that it's someone else who is getting the credit. Jesus assures them, and us, that any good work being undertaken genuinely in his name is to be welcomed. It is a reminder to us that sometimes we look down on the work of others because 'they're not one of us', or 'they're not doing it our way'.

The second portion of the gospel is one of the really challenging teachings of Jesus. Drawing on the image of the community as being a whole body, the teaching suggests that it is better to remove the part of the body/community that is causing sinfulness than have the whole body/ community perish. It is a concept we are familiar with in modern medicine: sometimes it is necessary to remove diseased tissue to prevent the spread of disease. We are reminded that if we surround ourselves with negative people and negative influences, we too will become negative. If we separate ourselves from negative influences and surround ourselves with positive ones then the positive aspects of our lives will flourish.

The disciples are portrayed as being jealous of someone healing in the name of Jesus. It is almost an intellectual property argument — you can't use Jesus' name to heal, only we can 'cause we're with Jesus. Their attitude sounds quite childish but it is an attitude we encounter all the time — and are perhaps guilty of ourselves at times. In our world that encourages competitive behaviour at every turn, Jesus' attitude is a challenging one — if good is being done, why care who gets the credit for it?


Reflect
