Focus by Fr Andrew Hogan



Look, now is the acceptable time, look, now is the day of salvation!

(2 Corinthians 6:2)

We are at the penultimate Sunday for the liturgical year and our readings draw us in to consider the final things, the end of times. This scriptural theme forms a bridge with the first Sunday of Advent, which begins with the end of times. Such thoughts can often strike fear into the hearts of many but we should take solace and comfort in two very important facts.

The first comfort is that Jesus tells us that, "about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven nor the Son, but only the Father." It can be a pastime for some to interpret the events of the day as signs and portents for the end of times but this is knowledge known only by the Father. We should not be swayed one way or another by such predictions especially if we are faithful to our baptismal calling to love God and to love our neighbour.

The second comfort is that Jesus tells us that, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." All that is worldly: power, wealth, popularity, disease, poverty, and death - all these things will pass but God's wisdom and his plan for our salvation will remain forever. What Christ has accomplished through his life, passion, death, and resurrection will be forever.

As Jesus sat on the Mount of Olives, his prophetic language undoubtedly shocked his apostles, as it does us. However, it served to highlight the irreversible and permanent disruption that his impending death would bring to their lives. Jesus' death and resurrection should disrupt our lives also. As we are intimately united to his life, death, and resurrection through our baptism, may we live lives that embody his word: the word that will never pass away.

My dear people of the Rockhampton Diocese

Re: COVID-19 Vaccination

Over these 18 months, we have been negotiating life around the pandemic of COVID-19. As a senior citizen, I was offered the vaccine in one of the earlier tranches.

I reflected on the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith guidelines and was guided by the Holy Father. The Congregation's document clarifying the moral questions involved can be found at the following link: www.vatican.va/roman curia/congregations/cfaith/documents/rc con cfaith doc 20201221 nota-vaccini-anticovid en.html

In summary, the Congregation's document makes the following observations:

- The destruction of unborn human life for medical research or treatment is, and has always been, a gravely immoral
 act.
- Despite this moral evil having taken place decades ago, and the fact that some current vaccines have been developed
 using cells obtained from these abortions, the reception of such vaccines today is not morally sinful, because of the
 seriousness of the pandemicand because the co-operation in the immoral act by the person receiving the vaccine is
 remote.
- If people have a choice, they should choose the vaccine that is not developed with the assistance of immoral actions; but if they do not have a choice, they are morally free toreceive the vaccine that has been developed with such assistance.

These guidelines were published in my letter to the Diocese in February this year and come from the documents of the teaching office of the Catholic Church.

Many people have died here in Australia and overseas from the effects of COVID-19. The Holy Father's own personal doctor died from COVID-19.

From my own perspective, I have been receiving vaccines and inoculations for all my life. I remember receiving the painful tetanus injection when I ran a nail into my foot while on the farm, then there was the close call of polio and tuberculosis in the 1950's and recently I lined up, because of my age, for the shingles injection. I marvel at the miracles of medical science.

Yet, before I underwent the AstraZeneca (Vaxzervia) vaccine, I consulted the specialist physician at the Mater Hospital. It was on his advice, together with my orthopaedic surgeon and my GP, that I have now received the two doses of the vaccine. In receiving the vaccine, I wanted to protect my health and those whom I may meet through my pastoral ministry.

As your Bishop, I would encourage all who reside in the Diocese to join the vaccination program. The facts are very clear. The virus is present in our country and has found its way into our regions. We are indeed fortunate to have one of the best medical supports in the world, but an outbreak in our region will place enormous strain on our medical staff and hospitals.

Some people, however, may have a valid medical reason for not receiving the vaccination. If you believe this could be the case, you should, as I did, seek proper medical advice.

The Holy Father urged all people as 'an act of love' to get vaccinated. In communion with the Holy Father, I strongly urge all involved in church ministry of our Diocese to get vaccinated, as our ministry involves contact with other people, including those more vulnerable.

St Louise de Marillac Conference Celebrating 50 years



In November 1971, Fr. Paul Dryden, then Diocesan President of the St. Vincent de Paul Society for Rockhampton Diocese, called a meeting of ladies from the Wandal Parish who would be interested in forming a ladies conference. This meeting was held on the 23rd. Ten ladies attended and three apologies were tended. After a lengthy discussion, about the aims and work of the Society, it was unanimously decided to form a Ladies Conference. Elections then followed and executive positions filled.

It was decided to hold meetings weekly on Tuesday mornings with Conference going into recess during school holidays as most of the members had <u>children at school</u>. The first meeting held on the 30th of November 1971. The St Louise de Marillac conference was aggregated (officially recognised) on 7th August 1972.

Members of the St Louise de Marillac Conference have volunteered at the St Vincent de Paul stores at the main centre and the Wandal clothing store. Members have also volunteered at the Support Centre where two of the current members continue weekly. Members have always <u>visited the sick</u> and lonely at their homes, hospitals or nursing homes and continue to do so. A corporal work of mercy.

Meetings of the St Louise de Marillac Conference have continued to meet weekly until March 2020 when they recessed due to Covid 19. Meetings recommenced again this year but now on a monthly basis. Current Conference membership is five ladies.




