FOCUS by Fr Matthias Ogwo

The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the mystery of Christian faith and life (CCC 234). It teaches us that there are three divine persons in one God, sharing the same Divine nature: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.


