# **Gospel Reflection by Fr Bill Senn**

"Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life!"

These words of Simon Peter, friends, in response to Jesus' question to the Twelve regarding the departure of various people from the wider group of disciples; in response to various teachings of Jesus which some found difficult to accept. A conversation begins among them, both the Twelve and the wider group of disciples with the result being that some of the disciples decided to leave the group; and some decided to remain and continue to follow the Lord.

Decisions like this are not usually an easy task. As members of God's holy people through Baptism, we are called to walk together on a *journey of discernment*; a journey of being **open** in our growing towards maturity in Christ. This is the invitation, friends, as brothers and sisters .. in Christ, the One who has the Words of Eternal Life! The One who always walks closely with us on the road, as we place our trust in him.

May we dare to become people who taste, see and experience fully the love and light of the Lord! Amen!




It is not always easy to be a follower of Jesus, but if we make that choice we know that we will always be strengthened in the Eucharist.
