## Gospel

John 15:9-17

Jesus spends his last hours with his closest companions, speaking of love-abiding in love, living each day with joy, and bearing the fruits of that love and joy.

## Next Weekend's Readings:

1st: Acts 1:1-11

Conversion is the work of a lifetime. Even after Jesus has taught his disciples in his risen body for forty days, they still miss the point, modelling their expectations of the kingdom on the values and patterns of worldly power and prestige.

Responsorial Psalm: 46:2-3, 6-9

2nd: Ephesians 1:17-23 or 4:1-13

Growing to spiritual maturity and into the body of Christ is not about spectacular signs and wonders. Day by day, by responding to God's grace in the quiet and steady practice of virtues, we develop the gifts needed for the building of God's kingdom.

Gospel: Mark 16:15-20

Mark's Gospel ends with listing miraculous signs and wonders that will identify the followers of Christ. But the true wonder is that as sinful human beings we can nevertheless be heralds of God's kingdom, producing in our lives and witness the fruits of God's Holy Spirit.
